

Computer Skills Assessments

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Introduction

The Connections course *Meet the Computer* is designed for students who have little or no computer experience. This course covers basics such as turning a computer on and off, and using the mouse and keyboard. By attending *Meet the Computer*, inexperienced students will be better prepared to continue in the Connections curriculum.

Which students attend *Meet the Computer* is at the discretion of the OASIS Director, Connections Coordinator or Participating Partner. If a student has never used a computer before, he or she will benefit from attending *Meet the Computer* before attending other Connections courses. However, if it is unclear whether or not a student will benefit from attending *Meet the Computer*, one or more of the following computer skills assessment may be used to assess a student's computer skill level.

Complete assessment instructions for both instructor and student are contained in this document. The assessment options are:

- **Connections Quiz**: A two-page quiz in which students identify common computer icons and terms
- **Ten Thumbs Typing Test**: A two-minute typing test online during which students demonstrate typing and mousing skills
- **TypingTest.com**: A one-minute typing test online during which students demonstrate typing and mousing skills

Use of these assessments is optional and at the discretion of the OASIS Director, Connections Coordinator or Participating Partner. Please review this entire document to become familiar with all the assessment options before you begin conducting student assessments.

How to Conduct the Connections Quiz

Follow the steps below to conduct this assessment.

- 1. This assessment may be used on any student who wishes to be assessed and no computer is necessary.
- 2. Give the student a copy of the quiz on the next two pages. Do <u>not</u> give the student any other pages of this document.
- 3. Provide a desk and pencil or pen for the student and a quiet place to take the quiz.
- 4. The quiz should take 5-10 minutes to complete. Allow more time if needed.
- 5. When the student is done, grade the quiz using the key in the back of this guide.
- 6. Fill in the information at the bottom of the first page of the quiz.
- 7. Record the student's name and score on the tracking form in the back of this guide.
- 8. Give the graded quiz back to the student and review the correct answers with him or her.
- 9. All students are invited to attend *Meet the Computer*. However, students scoring 80% or higher may elect not to attend *Meet the Computer*.
- 10. Students scoring below 80% will benefit from taking Meet the Computer.
- 11. If a student scores below 80%, do <u>not</u> say that the student "failed the test." Instead say, "Your score indicates that you will benefit from taking the course *Meet the Computer*. Let's get you scheduled for the next session."
- 12. The student may keep his or her graded quiz. Make a copy if you need to keep one for administrative purposes.

How to Conduct the Ten Thumbs Typing Test

Follow the steps below to conduct this assessment.

- 1. Only use this assessment for students who have some computer experience, know how to use a mouse and are familiar with a keyboard.
- 2. A computer with Java and Internet access is required. Try the steps on the next page to be sure the designated computer can run the typing test. (The assessment uses the <u>online</u> test. You do not have to download the Ten Thumbs software.) If the designated computer cannot run the test, substitute another assessment.
- 3. Open the web page **www.tenthumbstypingtutor.com** for the student.
- 4. Give the student a copy of the assessment on the next page. Do <u>not</u> give the student any other pages from this guide.
- 5. Instruct the student to read the instructions and take the test. The test should take 5-10 minutes to complete. Allow more time if needed. If necessary, students can restart the test until they get the hang of it.
- 6. Do <u>not</u> help students click the buttons to start the test—this is part of the assessment. If a student cannot follow the instructions to start and take the typing test, substitute the *Connections Quiz*.
- 7. When the student is done, fill in the *Location*, *Organization* and *WPM* blanks at the bottom of the test instructions.
- 8. Record the student's name and score on the tracking form in the back of this guide.
